

Vision: To create a world in which every person impacted by borderline personality disorder has access to treatment, resources and support to achieve a meaningful recovery.

Programs







Peer BPD Online Support Groups

Emotions Matter held 28 peer support groups serving 321 individuals with BPD in 2020 on SupportGroupsCentral.com.

Groups were facilitated by nine volunteers. Five new facilitators were trained on Emotions Matter's program focusing on four recovery principles: advocacy, trust, community and purpose. Attendance and demand increased from 2019 due to the global health pandemic.

BPD Connections & Webinars

Emotions Matter offered 10 BPD Connections programs in 2020 involving 135 attendees and 30 volunteers.

Program shifted from in person model in NYC in March to Zoom, in which peer panelists were invited to speak on a variety of recovery topics. Attendees came from around the country.

Emotions Matter also held webinars on Mindfulness, Recovery and Stigma with over 340 attendees.

Writing & Wellness Workshops

Emotions Matter introduced workshops in 2020 to help our BPD community stay connected with COVID-19.

We held 5 writing workshops, and 2 art workshops, facilitated by peers in recovery. These workshops were attended by 40 individuals with BPD. Attendees shared expressive art and writing about the BPD experience in a supportive community.

2020 Virtual Art Show & Book

Emotions Matter held a Virtual Art Show in 2020 involving 15 artists from around the country highlighting different aspects of the BPD experience. An Artist's Roundtable Discussion, Video and Art Book were produced from this event with over 100 people attending to improve BPD education and highlight voices of recovery.

Educational Video: The Myths and Facts about Borderline Personality Disorder

Emotions Matter released a new 20 minute educational video in 2020 correcting the Myths and Facts about Borderline Personality Disorder. We partnered with Clearview Treatment Center in Los Angeles, CA to hold three launch events in which over 300 attended. Since its release, the video has had over 2,000 views on YouTube, and will be used for professional education in 2021.

Publication: BPD in Schools Publication


Emotions Matter launched a new publication in 2020, Supporting Students with Borderline Personality Disorder: A Guide for Educational Professionals, Parents and Students.

BPD Loss Support Group

Emotions Matter held 12 monthly BPD Loss Support Groups in 2020 attended 37 times by those who have experience the loss of a loved one from BPD. This program involved 3 new volunteer leaders and shifted to ZOOM because of COVID-19. It aims to help those on the loss journey from BPD feel less alone and more supported.




Looking Forward: 2020-2022 Strategic Plan

With government support, we completed our **2020-2022 Strategic Plan** which outlines the following four strategic priorities:


- 1) Financial Sustainability Seek Funding to support growth and long-term stability.
